Nancy Feeley, RN PhD



Nancy Feeley RN PhD is Associate Professor, Ingram School of Nursing, McGill University, and Senior Researcher at the Centre for Nursing Research and Lady Davis Research Institute of the West-Central Montreal Centre for Integrated Care, Jewish General Hospital in Montreal. She is also Co-Director of the provincially funded Quebec Network on Nursing Intervention Research (RRISIQ). Her program of research focuses on parents' psychological adjustment and parenting in perinatal period with a focus on parents of NICU infants. She conducted some of the earliest studies on fathers' experiences in the neonatal intensive care unit, and on posttraumatic stress symptoms in mothers.

Professor Jill WHITE AM is a Professor Emerita of the Faculty of Nursing and Midwifery at the University of Sydney and the Faculty of Health University of Technology, Sydney (UTS), Australia. Iill recently formally retired and is now an independent consultant in the areas of health education, regulation and policy. Prof. Euan Wallace AM

Professor Euan Wallace AM is the inaugural Chief Executive Officer of Safer Care Victoria, Victoria's lead agency for quality and safety improvement in healthcare. Professor Wallace is an academic obstetrician and gynaecologist by training. Prior to his appointment to Safer Care Victoria, Professor Wallace was the Director of the Women's Health Program at Monash Health, Victoria's largest women's health service. In that role, he established a clinical governance framework to drive and embed a culture of healthcare improvement.



Prof. Mary Chiarella

Professor Mary Chiarella is Professor of Nursing at Sydney Nursing School and an internationally renowned nurse leader with a distinguished career in nursing services. She has qualifications in Nursing, Midwifery and Law and conducts research covering three broad themes: (a) safety & quality (b) law, ethics and regulatory issues; and (c) improvements in nursing practices/models of care. In 2001, as Foundation Professor of Nursing at Corrections Health (now Justice Health) with UTS, she was instrumental in developing key competence requirements for the organisation's nurses and in the official recognition of a new scope of practice for Nurse Practitioners in NSW, the Justice Health Nurse Practitioner. From 2009 to 2015 she was the NSW practitioner representative on the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA) and Chair of the Policy Committee of the NMBA.



Dr. Mark Greenhalgh

Dr Mark Greenhalgh is a neonatologist in the NICU at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital Sydney. He has previously worked at Royal North Shore Hospital, within the Sydney Children's Hospital Network, and in Adelaide at Women's and Children's Hospital. He has a Master of Clinical Education, and as part of this is passionate about improving how families and staff are educated around involvement in family centred care. Mark is a dad to three children, two of whom were patients in a neonatal ICU. His current project is investigating methods to improve support for fathers during their baby's neonatal admission.
