On a global level we hold a commitment to maternal and newborn health aligning our strategies with Every Newborn Action Plan, Sustainable Development Goals, Global Strategy for Women's and the Children's and Adolescent' Health and Global Financing Facility.

What we do...

- Use socially just and sustainable solutions for capacity-building and collaboration with partners
- Provide education on health topics including: infection prevention and management, kangaroo care, thermoregulation, care of the small and sick neonate
- Provide education and practical training on neonatal resuscitation and care of the newborn to reduce preventable deaths.
