<p>objectives and points in the strategic plan for the upcoming years.</p> <p>The objectives include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • we want to really strengthen the social media committee, and the reason for that is because actually having a social media presence allows us to be consistent and sustainable in terms of our events, but also any of our college's updates. Being out there, being aware in the community is really important for us. • we want to have meaningful engagement with our members. Our social media following is also the highest it's ever been. We do have a lot of social media followers that aren't members, but that makes sense, because we also link in with people from our neighbouring countries or connections with COINN, even family and friends like to see what we're doing. So, it's really important that we have meaningful engagement with people, so that they continue to share and like what we're doing, and help us promote, all the great things that we're doing. • lastly, we really want to make sure we have a social media presence, so we can drive consistent traffic to all our events. Everyone's doing these amazing presentations, seminars, even now conferences, and if we don't publicise it, if we don't advertise it out there in the world, then we may have limitations to how many people come. So, promotion is a huge part of our social media objectives. <p>Other changes that have come with the strategic plan, and particularly around 2026 include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • branches and SIGs to now increase their social media content to 6 posts a year as a minimum. We used to say two posts a year per branch and SIG. It's just not really enough to be consistent and to keep people in the spotlight. So, this has come from a lot of data around our social media platforms and what works in terms of algorithms. • to help do that, we're formalising the social media liaison's roles within each subcommittee. We are asking these roles to drive the content planning or creation if they can. Some people are really creative and want to be in photos or want to make some images. Not everyone is into that, and that's okay, but what they are responsible for is actually taking information back to their branch/sig, talking about it at committee meetings, and then liaising back with the social media committee. People are interested in it; they trust that the comments are valuable. So even if it is you see your friend that's just presented at one of our conferences, and you can go, oh, so great to see Sarah, I haven't seen her in so long, it shows the platforms that we're actually having engaging content that people want to see. • a simple like, if you like, or heart us on our social media platforms that just acknowledges to the systems that these are things people want to see. <p>So, they're really simple ways that you can help. <p>10.1</p>	<p>Newsletter update – moving to electronic submission and production – Amy Curran & Sarah Neale We are planning to do 6 newsletter editions a year. The reason we've done this is because we really want a timely response to the information that's submitted.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For branches and SIGs, you still only need to contribute four articles a year. • Commenced using an online form to try to streamline the process. Hopefully, it shortens and makes it less onerous for people to actually put in a submission, but second, we're hoping that it actually makes it easier for us to correlate all of the submissions and get them out in a more timely manner, rather than going through lots of emails backwards and forwards. • When you submit your submission, your article, we're really, really encouraging photos. Obviously, they're not mandatory, and some articles, some content won't be appropriate for photos. But to make it a more visually appealing newsletter, and not just a massive Word document, we'd really encourage photos or images, so that would be the first step that you can add on to the electronic form. • The other point with the form is it isn't format-friendly, so if you've spent a lot of time working on your document, in a Word document that you think that's exactly how it's going to go into the newsletter. Unfortunately, that's probably not how it's going to work. When you submit your submission through the online form, it's just plain text. The editors who will be working on correlating all that and putting it into a nice, pretty template will work out, some formatting in terms of bullet points, maybe things are bold, etc. If you are very, very strongly opinionated on where's bold, where's the heading, etc, please just put it in the context. We've also limited the word count (600 words). 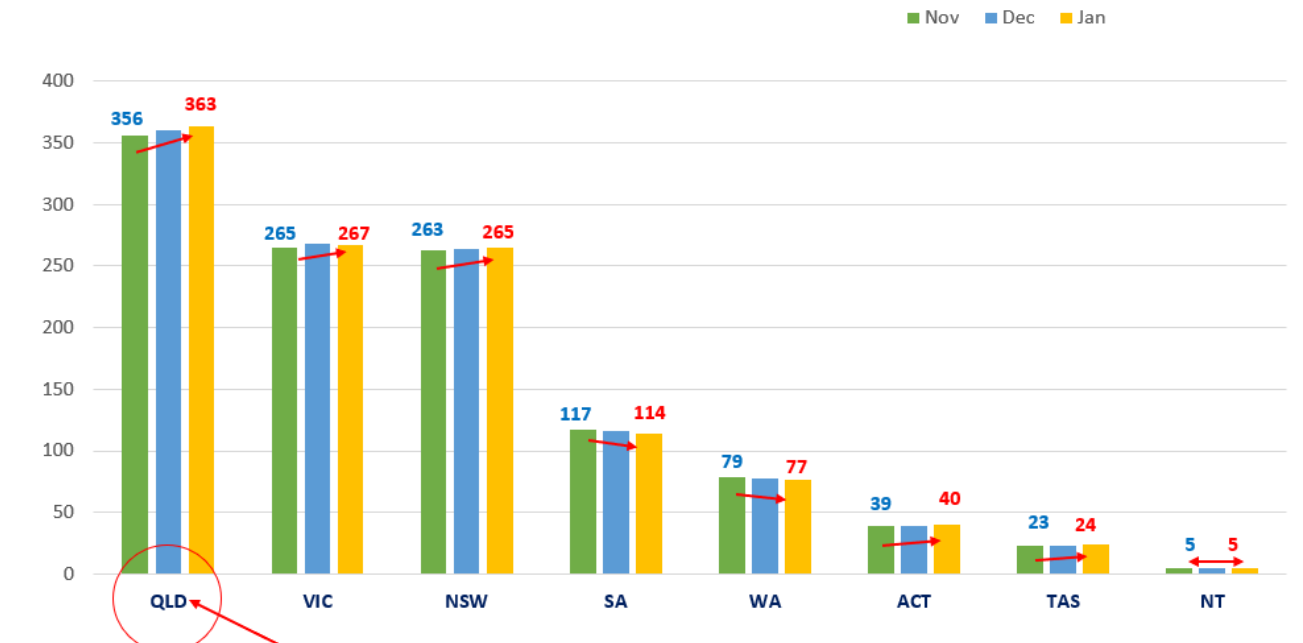

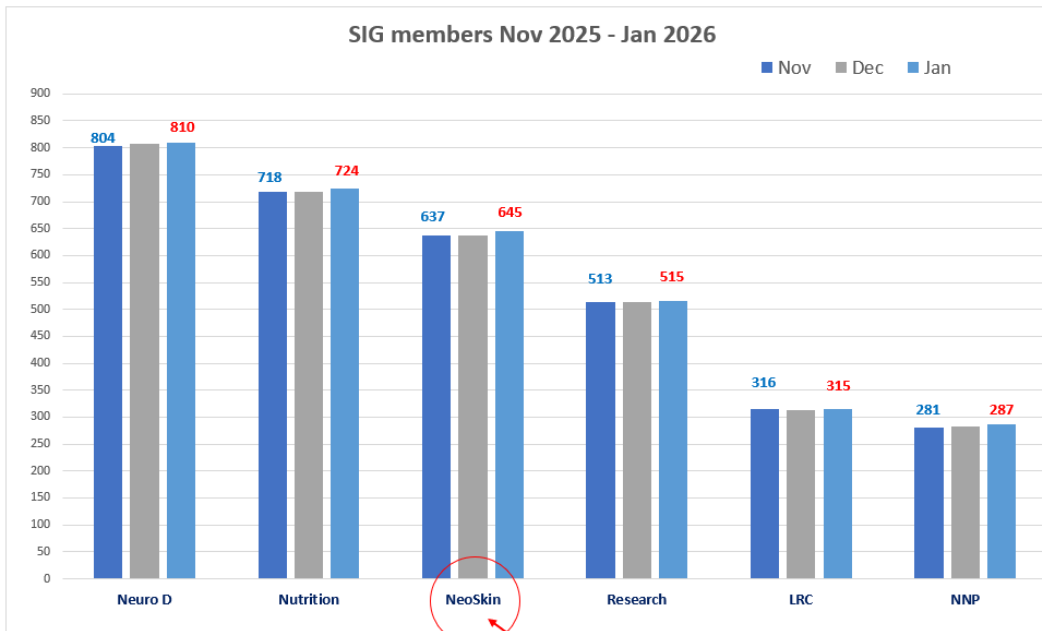
