Call for Nominations

Open year round

ACNN members are invited to nominate colleagues for the Mark New Quite Achiever Award, in recognition of their dedication and commitment to neonatal nursing, research/evidenced-based practice and engagement in ACNN.

Nominated neonatal nurses will have met the minimum criteria and one or more of the additional criteria:

Minimum criteria

- Is regarded as a quiet achiever
- Has presented (oral or poster) at a local, national or international conference
- Has <u>not</u> been an invited speaker at an international conference
- Has completed postgraduate study

Additional criteria

- Has consistently been involved in neonatal research or clinical practice improvement spanning several years
- Has built research capacity within their neonatal environment by mentoring colleagues
- Has published as first author in a peer-reviewed journal
- Has demonstrated translation of research into clinical practice

Eligibility

- Current financial member of ACNN
- ACNN member for a minimum of two (2) years before nomination
- Has actively contributed to ACNN through Special Interest Group/s, Branch or National committee

Nomination Process

- Outline in no more than two (2) A4 pages with font size no less than 12 points, why the member is considered a quiet achiever and addressing the minimum and additional criteria (if relevant)

 All nominations received will be acknowledged by email within 48 hours. In not acknowledged, please resend or contact Dr Linda Ng, the Professional Officer.

Award
